## **Supplies**

For Doll Body

- 100% cotton woven fabric in skin color of your choice
- Spoonflower fat quarter print of Twinkle Doll faces and body pattern (optional replacement for skin fabric)

- Thread for sewing doll in slightly lighter color than the fabric
- Darker thread for sewing the toes (optional)

#### For the Doll Face

If you are using Spoonflower fabric skip this section

- Freezer paper or quilters' freezer paper for printing the face onto fabric (optional)
- Masking tape to help with printing on fabric (optional)
- Prismacolor® peach pencil and thin line air soluble pen for marking
- Boxes of waterproof colored pencils in primary colors and earth tones
- Thin line permanent markers in red, black, brown, and blue or brown for the eyes
- White acrylic paint and a thin brush (eyes)
- Powdered blush (optional)

For Constructing the Doll Body

- Polyester stuffing
- Freezer paper for making arm and leg templates (optional)
- Pairs of 3/8" (9 mm) flat buttons and 1/2" (12 mm) flat buttons with two eyes for stringing arms and legs
- Unwaxed dental floss
- Seam sealant and wax paper
- Fabric glue stick

### For Doll Hair

- Size 4 to 4½ commercial wig (optional)
- If you are making the hair
  - 4 skeins of embroidery floss for hair in the color of your choice
  - O Permanent fabric glue (Elmer's® Xtreme® Glue Stick works well)
  - Tear-away stabilizer

# **Equipment**

- An open embroidery foot to use when following sewing lines for arms and legs
- One 21/4" (6 cm) or longer needle for stringing the arms and legs
- Stuffing tools such as a hemostat, chopstick, and an inexpensive paintbrush (use the smooth end)
- A cylindrical object (such as an unsharpened pencil) to keep the neck open while attaching the head
- Doll hairbrush, toothbrush, or fine comb to separate embroidery floss
